

Tragic discovery of 5-year old child's body

Guwahati: A tragic incident unfolded in Margherita when the body of five-year-old Abhimanyu Chakraborty was discovered in the Buridehing River on Monday. Abhimanyu, a resident of ward number 1, Lazum, had gone missing during the Navami Durga Puja celebrations. In response to the heartbreaking discovery, over 500 locals gathered on Tuesday to hold a candle march near the boy's residence. The procession culminated at the Margherita police station, where participants demanded capital punishment

for those responsible for the crime. Pratap Gogoi, the officer in charge at Margherita police station, addressed the crowd, urging them to maintain faith in the police's efforts. He assured that the authorities are committed to apprehending the culprits swiftly. Amit Ganguly, Abhimanyu's maternal uncle, expressed his belief that the incident was a premeditated murder. He called on the Margherita police to identify the perpetrators and ensure they face the harshest punishment under the law.

Voting on November 13 By-polls announced for five constituencies

Guwahati: The Election Commission of India announced today, October 15, the schedule for by-polls in five assembly constituencies in Assam. The by-polls will be conducted in Bongaigaon, Sidli, Behali, Samaguri, and Dholai on November 13, with the counting of votes scheduled for November 23. The Gazette Notification will be issued on October 18, and the last date for filing nomination papers is October 25. The scrutiny of nomination papers is set for October 28, and candidates can withdraw their nominations by October 30. The by-polls have been necessitated by the election of incumbent legislators to the Lok Sabha in the general elections held earlier this year. MLAs who transitioned to the Lok Sabha include BJP's Parimal Suklabaidya, who represented the Dholai Assembly segment and won the Cachar Lok Sabha seat,

and Ranjit Dutta from Behali, who secured the Tezpur parliamentary seat. Veteran AGP leader Phani Bhushan Choudhury, who has held the Bongaigaon constituency since 1985, successfully contested the Barpeta Lok Sabha seat, while UPPL's Joyanta Basumatary won the Kokrajhar seat after previously representing Sidli. Congress's Rakibul Hussain, a five-time MLA from Samaguri, claimed a decisive victory in Dhubri. In the upcoming by-polls on November 13, the BJP will contest in three constituencies—Behali, Dholai, and Samaguri. Meanwhile, its allies, Asom Gana Parishad (AGP) and United People's Party Liberal (UPPL), will field candidates in Bongaigaon and Sidli, respectively. Earlier, Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma had expressed confidence during his visit to Chirang on September 18, ahead of the Sidli by-polls.



DFCSO posts in APPSCCE notification

Arunachal aspirants demand inclusion of vacant

Itanagar: Some of the aspirants of the Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Combined Competitive Examination (APPSCCE) in resentment, have said that the Department of Food and Civil Supplies, Government of Arunachal Pradesh or the APPSCCE authorities have not included the vacant posts under civil supplies in the recently notified APPSCCE notification. The interested aspirants in the post of District Food & Civil Supplies Officer have said that there are no posts shown or included in the APPSCCE notification despite several vacant posts under the Food and Civil Supplies department lying vacant. It is said that about five posts of DFCSO and others are lying vacant under the Food & Civil Supplies department which were not notified in the recent APPSC combined competitive examination. The aspirants have appealed to the authorities of APPSC to get the total posts vacant under the civil supplies de-



partment in order to fill the vacant posts via APPSCCE like in the last exam wherein the commission had included the vacant posts. As per some sources from within the Department of Civil Supplies, couple of vacant posts of DFCSO in the districts and the directorate office are being managed by the junior officers as in-charge due to non-recruitment of new officers. When contacted to the authorities concerned of the department in order to get their version, Opak Gao, Secretary, Food & Civil Supplies, Government of Arunachal Pradesh said that the department was not having the total list of va-

cant posts by the time when the vacant posts were to be given to the APPSC for notification. "One post which was lying vacant due to the suspension of an officer in the rank of DFSCO in connection with last APPSCCE paper leak scams, was initially listed to recommend to APPSC, but that was withdrawn due to the case still pending in the court which if given clean chit will be bound to reinstated. But more details on other vacant posts can be obtained from the junior officers like joint director", added Gao. When Lt. Director, FCS, Jummar Koyu was contacted, he declined to comment

anything on the matter of vacant posts under the department. He suggested this scribe to get the details from the Director who couldn't be contacted till the filing of this report. As per the sources, two posts of DFCSOs are said to be remaining vacant at the directorate office, two posts at Aalo in West Siang District and one at Roing under Lower Dibang Valley district which if are really vacant, need to be filled up soon through APPSCCE. Recruiting energetic and talented fresh graduate/post graduate youths in all the vacant posts under FCS and other departments including in the newly created districts across the state would not only would have solved the unemployment concerns of the state, but it would have also released the burdens of other officers as well. In this case the APPSC and other concerned authorities also need to timely collect the exact and complete vacant posts in all the departments from all the districts.

Ceasefire Supervisory Board chief accuses NSCN-K Nikki Sumi of violating

Kohima: The Ceasefire Supervisory Board chairman, Amarjeet Singh Bedi accused the Nikki Sumi faction of NSCN-K of abducting two Naga youths, violating the laid down ceasefire rules. Two youths were allegedly abducted from Dimapur over illegal taxation demand on October 10. The chairman held separate closed-door meetings on October 14 with representatives of NSCN-K, Dimapur-based civil society organisations and youth bodies at Police

Complex in Chumoukedima. After holding a meet with the Naga underground group leaders, he said that the Nikki Sumi faction of NSCN-K has been found accountable for the violation of ceasefire ground rules as well as misuse of the ceasefire office. Noting that the group agreed in writing that they were ready to adhere to all the ground rules, Bedi said that he asked the NSCN-K Nikki Sumi group to make all efforts to apprehend those involved in the ab-



duction who may have acted in an individual capacity and hand them over to the police so that necessary action can be taken as per the law. Bedi said that the Centre and the NSCN-K signed the ceasefire agreement in 2021 and thereafter extended it last month for a period of one year.

United Naga Council denounces emergence



Imphal: In response to the formation of a new organization named the "United Tribal Council Manipur", the United Naga Council (UNC), the leading body representing Nagas in Manipur, has issued a press statement to clarify its stance. The UNC expressed concerns over the growing number of organizations with names such as "United Tribal," "All Manipur," "Tribal Unity," and "Indigenous Tribal" that claim to represent communities without proper grassroots structure or legitimate mandate. The UNC reiter-

ated a message previously shared on June 16, 2023, through social media and print outlets, emphasizing that statements or narratives from such unrecognized bodies do not reflect the authentic voice or aspirations of the people. The council stressed that these emerging groups lack legitimate representation and warned the public against accepting their claims of authority. The UNC's statement aims to dispel confusion and reaffirm its position as the genuine apex body for the Naga community in the region.

Meghalaya's Khliehrangnah 'Best Panchayat'

Shillong/Agartala: Tripura's Dhalai has been awarded the 'Best District' tag, while Meghalaya's Khliehrangnah in West Jaintia Hills has been named the 'Best Panchayat' at the 5th National Water Awards 2023 in the Northeast, as announced by the Union Ministry of Jal Shakti. The Department of Water Resources, River Development, and Ganga Rejuvenation (DoWR, RD &GR), under the Ministry of Jal Shakti announced the 38 winners, including joint winners, for the 5th National Water Awards, 2023, in 09 categories viz Best State, Best District, Best Village Panchayat, Best Urban Local Body, Best School or College, Best Industry, Best Water User Association, Best Institution, and Best Civil Society. Under the Northeast zone, Dhalai district of Tripura emerged as winner. "Major achievements of District in the field of water conservation include creation of 748 community recharge

structures, micro irrigation systems in additional 15 hectares of land, excavation of 63 ponds, construction of 176 check dams with storage capacity of 9 lakh cubic metres and construction of 137 water tanks for rainwater harvesting", said a PIB press release. It informed that in addition, 25,684 water bodies available in the district have been geo tagged and mapped. 41.32 lakhs of miscellaneous and bamboo tree saplings have been nurtured and planted across the district's expanse. "Community engagement with local communities through interactive sessions, awareness campaigns, workshops and training sessions, has been undertaken to explain water usage patterns and to encourage community participation in conservation and management initiatives," the statement said. Meanwhile, Khliehrangnah, West Jaintia Hills of Meghalaya named as Best Panchayat award in third winner.

Assam Agricultural University Researchers develop new high-yield mustard greens and chilli varieties

Guwahati: In a significant achievement for Assam's agricultural sector, research scientists at Assam Agricultural University (AAU) have developed two high-yielding varieties of mustard greens, named "Kajali" and "Laika," along with a new chilli variety called "Prabali." This development promises to transform farming practices during the rabi season, offering farmers a much-needed boost in productivity and economic potential. The University's Department of Horticulture, after five years of dedicated research, has introduced these new varieties to address the longstanding challenges faced by local farmers. Traditional mustard greens, a staple in Assamese cuisine, have seen limited yields over the years, restricting supply and impacting local diets. The newly developed "Kajali" and "Laika" varieties are poised to change that by offering higher yields and resilience, meeting both cultural and dietary needs. These innovations are set to yield substantial benefits, with the leafy greens expected to produce two crop cycles over an 85-90 day period, amounting to an estimated 400-450 quintals per hectare. The "Laika" variety stands



out for its dark green color, long slender leaves, and authentic Assamese flavor, while "Kajali" offers similar qualities but with a unique blackish hue that inspired its name. Meanwhile, the "Prabali" chilli variety promises to deliver a fiery heat and impressive productivity, yielding around 120-130 quintals per hectare. Both the mustard greens and chilli varieties boast high nutritional content, enhancing the availability of

nutrient-rich vegetables and adding value to the Assamese diet. The introduction of these high-yield varieties is also expected to open new commercial opportunities for farmers, who can now cater to the rising demand for mustard greens and chillies. With increased production potential, these varieties aim to address the current shortfall in supply and allow farmers to capitalize on lucrative market prospects.

Meghalaya government seeks Rs 600 crore financial aid



Shillong: The Meghalaya government has sought financial aid of Rs 600 crore from the Central government aiming to strengthen and improve the overall functioning of the social welfare department. Minister in charge, social welfare department, Paul Lyngdoh on October 14 said that he has reviewed the functioning and funding position of the directorate and the interventions, which is required to be taken by the state. He further said, "Certain matters will also have to be taken to the cabinet, certain matters will also have to be taken to the five ministries dealing with our department here in Meghalaya." Lyngdoh added that additional interventions would include more funding from the Ministry. He stated, "We have projected a deficit of about Rs 600 crore. There is also a need for us to improve the service conditions of the employees here," further explaining that

many are working on a contractual basis. "They have to stay over, those who are in the night shift. So things like that. We will try to enhance facilities for them so that they would be able to optimise the services that we can offer," Lyngdoh added. The minister also reviewed the functioning of the women and child helplines at the office of

the directorate of social welfare, exalting the presence of "highly tech savvy young boys and girls handling cases on a daily basis, cases of complaints for both child helpline and women helpline are done round the clock with three personnel manning for 8 hours shift continuously." He informed that there is space for distress call-

ers, whether children or women, to receive accommodation. When calls come in the middle of the night, they are picked up by female helpers or women police officers, as we ensure that male officers do not handle such cases due to the sensitivity of the matters involved. Lyngdoh appreciated the success rate in the child helpline cell, stating that about 90 per cent cases have been resolved and the information from various districts are updated round the clock in the dashboard. Meanwhile, the minister emphasised that not everything happening in Meghalaya is negative, stating that there is lot of positivity. "There are many highly motivated young men and women, working tirelessly to serve the society and its an incredible story when we hear that women facing domestic violence, for instance get immediate attention and support, our intervention as department."

If any harm comes to our brother, we will surely respond, though we never attacked first. Jai Shri Ram, Jai Bharat. Salute to the martyrs. #LawrenceBishnoiGroup#AnmolBishnoi #AnkitBhaduSherewala". So far, three suspects have been arrested in the murder case.

India's diplomatic standoff with Canada: Six diplomats expelled amid Nijjar allegations

Guwahati: India has expelled six Canadian diplomats, including Acting High Commissioner Stewart Ross Wheeler. This action follows Canada's allegations linking Indian diplomats to the June 2023 assassination of Hard-eep Singh Nijjar, a prominent Khalistan supporter.

The Indian Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) criticized the Canadian government for what it termed baseless accusations, asserting that the recent diplomatic communications from Canada were politically motivated. "We no longer trust the current Canadian government's commitment to ensuring the safety of our dip-

lomats," the MEA declared, highlighting the risk posed by the Trudeau administration's stance on separatism. This diplomatic spat could have significant implications for trade relations between India and Canada.



The US city reclaiming its Native roots



South of the Twin Cities of Minneapolis and Saint Paul, the confluence of the Minnesota and Mississippi rivers (known as Bdote, or "the place where the two rivers meet"), has been the most sacred site for the Indigenous Dakota people who have called this part of Minnesota home for thousands of years. "Bdote is considered to be the centre of the Earth and the birthplace of the Dakota people," said Eden Bart, of the Minnesota Humanities Center. Yet, it also marks the site of one of the most tragic historical events for the area's Native residents. In 1862, facing starvation and displacement by white settlers, a group of Dakota attacked white settlements, setting off a five-week war that led the US

government to exile the Dakota from their ancestral homeland and forcibly relocate them to reservations in the Dakotas and Nebraska. That winter, the Dakota were kept in concentration camps at Bdote guarded by US troops while waiting for the river to thaw so they could be sent away on boats. The sacred site soon became a mass grave, as 38 Dakota men were hung in a mass execution on 26 December and hundreds of people died from disease and malnutrition during the winter. Nearly a century later, following the Indian Relocation Act of 1956 in which Native Americans were incentivised by the US government to relocate from reservations to cities, many Dakota began returning to the area.


Now, more than 50 years after activists in Minneapolis spearheaded the modern fight for Native American rights, the Twin Cities are experiencing something of an Indigenous cultural renaissance and are one of the best places to explore modern Native culture in the US today. This cultural revival was inspired by decades of discrimination following the Relocation Act. Mike Forcia, a member of the Bad River Band of Lake Superior Chippewa, remembers moving with his family to inner-city Saint Paul in 1969. Over the next decade, his family moved back and forth between Saint Paul and the reservation, as his father struggled to hold a stable job. "As I grew up, I realised many families bounced around and it was not just our family that couldn't make it," he said. "We were told we were free and to assimilate. That was so hard for some of our people, and many turned to drugs and alcohol." In addition to the personal trauma and struggle to find footing off the reservation, Indigenous communities faced immense discrimination. "At the

time, Minneapolis' Franklin Avenue, which was the heart of the Indigenous community, was lined with bars," said Forcia. "Police would come and line people up and fill cars with Natives. There were stories of people getting picked up, beaten and thrown by the river." In the summer of

1968, roughly 200 members of

Minne-

apolis' Indigenous community gathered to address the police brutality and racial profiling of Native Americans.



New Delhi: A new study has found incredible weight loss and health benefits from including more legumes (beans in particular) in your daily diet. The study found that consuming two servings of beans daily is "significantly associated" with a lower BMI, reduced body weight, and a slimmer waistline. The researchers found these positive results after incorporating pinto beans, chickpeas, black beans, and kidney beans into the diets of the study participants. The findings of the study were published in the Nutrition Journal. For the study, participants were divided into five groups based on their total bean consumption. Group 1 consumed the most beans, while Group 5 rarely incorporated legumes into their meals. Pinto beans, chickpeas, black beans, and kidney beans were the preferred choices. Soybeans were excluded.



The middle group had the lowest calorie contribution from beans. Group 1 reported an increased vegetable intake, while Group 4 consumed the most sweets and snacks. The researchers found that participants in Groups 1 and 2 had significantly lower body mass index (BMI), waist circumference, and body weight values. Apart from the weight loss benefits, the researchers also highlighted that regular bean eaters enjoy a higher quality diet packed with essential nutrients compared to those who do not eat beans. According to researchers, people who eat beans regularly also tend to adopt an overall healthier eating pattern, which reduces their chances of developing health problems like heart disease, cancer, and diabetes.

HIL auction Belgium's Wegnez costliest buy on Day 2

New Delhi: With all top Indian stars sold out on Day 1 of the Hockey India League (HIL) players' auction, it was the turn of the overseas big names to go under the hammer here on Monday. Expectedly, nine of the top 10 buys on Day 2 of the auction were foreign players with Tokyo Olympics gold medallist Victor Wegnez of Belgium being the costliest buy, going for ₹40 lakh to JSW Sports-owned Soorma Hockey Club. Paris Olympics gold medal winning captain Thierry Brinkman from the Netherlands was the second costliest buy, getting sold for ₹38 lakh to Kalinga Lancers while Argentine forward Tomas Domene went to Delhi SG Pipers for ₹36 lakh. Kalinga Lancers struck gold with Arthur van Doren, winning the Belgian legend for ₹32 lakh with rising midfielder M Rabichandra Singh being the most expensive Indian player on Day 2, getting sold to Kalinga Lancers for ₹32 lakh. The next most expensive buys were Arthur

de Sloover of Belgium (₹30 lakh to Hyderabad Toofans) and Australian Timothy Daniel (₹28 lakh to Hyderabad Toofans). Australia's Aran Zalewski (Kalinga Lancers) and Blake Govers (Tamil Nadu Dragons) and Dutchman Floritz Wortelboer (UP Rudras) were all sold for ₹27 lakh. However, the big surprises were Tokyo Olympics silver medallist goalkeeper Andrew Charter of Australia, English drag-flickers Sam Ward and Nick Bandurak, and German 2023 World Cup-winner Mats Grambusch not getting sold. Some of the Indian players who were bought for more than 10 times their base price were Angad Bir Singh (₹26 lakh to Kalinga Lancers) and Rajinder Singh (₹23 lakh to Hyderabad Toofans), who had the lowest base price of ₹2 lakh. Visakhapatnam-based Team Gonasika were the first to complete 20 players followed by Tamil Nadu Dragons and Soorma Hockey Club as the final four players per team were

sold in a closed bid. "Today, we were really trying to focus on the overseas players. I think we've done pretty well there. We've got some good experience and got some really good players in that line in the overseas side," said Delhi SG Pipers coach Graham Reid. "I am happy with the overall structure of the team. You have to move things around and depending on who comes up when and where and everything. So that's been the difficult part." Four teams for women's league Contrary to the earlier announcement, the first-ever women's Hockey India League (HIL) will have only four teams instead of six. It has been reliably learnt that Hockey India (HI) failed to find buyers of the last two franchises in time and the ones who came on board wanted to join in from the second season. The four women's teams now are Soorma Hockey Club (owned by JSW Sports), Bengal Tigers (Shrachi Sports), Delhi SG Pipers (SG Sports and Enter-

tainment) and Odisha Warriors Hyderabad Toofans and Mumbai-based BC Jindal Group have confirmed participation from Season 2. Hence, the women's auction, scheduled for Tuesday, will only have four teams bidding for the 320 odd players – 250 domestic and 70 overseas – up for auction for the 96 slots available. Each team will consist of 24 players, including 16 Indians (with a mandatory inclusion of four juniors) and eight overseas players. Franchises will have a purse of ₹2 crore with athletes categorised under three base price slabs – ₹10 lakh, ₹5 lakh and ₹2 lakh. Highlighting the event will be India's top women's players, including seasoned goalkeeper Savita, the most-capped Indian women's player Vandana Katariya, and forward Lalremsiami. Additionally, former India stalwarts such as Yogita Bali, Lilima Minz and Namita Topo have also registered. On the international front, renowned players such as Delfina Merino.

Stuff Reporter: Boxing great M C Mary Kom, who is also the chairperson of IOA's athletes' commission, says she has stopped giving suggestions to the National Olympic Committee as it doesn't pay attention to them. Mary Kom were among 10 elite sportspersons who were elected on the IOA athletes' commission back in November 2022. The IOA is currently witnessing intense infighting with a section of the office-bearers questioning the governance of president P T Usha, who has denied all allegations against her. "I am not into the IOA functioning. We shared so many things with IOA but they don't listen to it. I have a voice but they don't listen to what I suggest. I don't know politics and I don't want to blame anyone," Mary Kom told PTI when asked about the ongoing power struggle in the IOA. The boxers returned without a medal from the Paris Olympics and Mary Kom was terribly disappointed at

that outcome. The 41-year-old lamented that nobody in the Boxing Federation of India sought her help ahead of the Olympics. "I can't pinpoint what went wrong because they did not invite me at all. They could have used my experience. I can tell the boxers their weak and strong points," she said on the sidelines of Indian Gaming Convention.

The 2012 Olympic bronze medallist feels medals won't come regularly unless the coaching structure is revamped. "The coaching system is outdated. I have been trained by experienced coaches who are not achievers. I follow all their advice what they say but my knowledge is different to other boxers. They have the degrees and diploma but they don't have achievements. Winning medals matters a lot," added Mary Kom. She has also won as many as five Asian titles alongside a gold in 2014 Asian Games and 2018 Commonwealth Games.

Mike Hesson warns Australia Kohli's focus on winning games for India

New Zealand: Former New Zealand cricketer Mike Hesson talked about the rising concerns over Virat Kohli's form in Test cricket for India. He suggested that Kohli is at that stage of his career where his focus is on winning games for India and not personal milestones. He felt that this version of Kohli could prove to be dangerous for a team like Australia who will be hosting India for a five-match Test series, starting November 22. The fans and experts alike have pointed out Kohli's dipping numbers in the Fab Four race as the star batter has managed just two hundreds in the format since 2019. "I think Virat Kohli is at that stage in his career where he just wants to try and win games for India. And I think that's a dangerous stage for other sides, because if he's doing that rather than focusing on numbers, the big scores will come naturally. The ability to hold a tempo in Australia is so important—being able to counterattack and knowing the right moments to do so.

As mentioned, from 30 to 60 overs is a key phase. If Kohli is batting at that point, he won't let the game drift. It's about finding gaps, hitting gaps, getting ones and twos, and then, if they try and attack him, then he can counterattack," Mike Hesson told Jio Cinema. Kohli's much-awaited comeback in Tests saw him scoring 6 and 17 in the first Test. However, Kohli redeemed himself with a fluent 47 from just 35 balls, followed by an unbeaten 29. The Australia series will be key for Kohli, which has been his happy hunting ground since 2012. Hesson pointed out that Kohli looked in fine touch despite no big score against Bangladesh and said that he would thrive against teams like New Zealand and Australia. "He was in fine touch, and even though he didn't get big scores against Bangladesh, he looked like he was moving well and getting into good positions. After playing in New Zealand, heading to Australia will suit him, as he thrives in those conditions,"



Hesson said. In 25 Test matches, Kohli has scored 2042 against Australia at an average of 47.48 with eight hundreds. Hesson highlighted Kohli's role as a senior player to also guide the youngsters travelling to Australia for the first time. "He has the game and knows the conditions very well. The discussions he'll have with younger players will also be crucial in helping them apply their game to challenge the Australians in the best way possible."

Yashasvi shouldn't change his approach in Test series vs Australia

Agency: Former Indian cricketer Anil Kumble feels that Yashasvi Jaiswal should not change his aggressive approach during the Test series against Australia. He highlighted the confidence Jaiswal would have going into the series, knowing India won the series on their last two tours. Jaiswal enjoyed a prolific year in the whites for India and will be heading to Australia for the Border Gavaskar series with head held high.

This will be his first time touring Australia for a high-profile series, which will begin from November 22 in Perth. Jaiswal grabbed the eyeballs for his aggressive batting approach against England earlier this year and Bangladesh recently. "I don't think he will change his approach. The best part about him in this current Indian team is that, even though he's touring Australia for the first time and will be playing against Australia on their home soil for the first time, he has a big advantage. This Indian team is heading to Australia with two back-to-back se-



ries wins over them, which is a great confidence booster for a youngster," Kumble told Jio Cinema. Jaiswal has played only 11 Tests, having made his debut last year, and has already accumulated 1217 runs with three hundreds and seven fifties to his name. With plenty of records already to his name, Jaiswal couldn't have asked for a better start to his Test career than this. Kumble recalled the times when the youngsters had hesitation in their minds while facing the mighty Australians in their own den. However, he felt that Jaiswal would feel

more comfortable with India having dominated the Australians at their own home. "When other teams tour Australia, they often do so with some hesitation because of past failures. The intimidation factor is real, since previous teams haven't had much success there. But for this Indian side, coming off two series wins against Australia, the situation is much more comfortable." Jaiswal has always shown his hunger for scoring runs, as he recently became the first Indian opener in a decade to score two fifties in each innings of a Test match vs Bangladesh. He currently stands at the 2nd position after Joe Root with the most runs in the ongoing World Test Championship cycle. Kumble wanted Jaiswal to showcase his versatility and play as per the conditions in Australia. "His technique and hunger for runs will be key, and I don't see why he can't succeed in Australia. He's been prolific throughout this WTC cycle. We saw him play with a different approach against Bangladesh—starting cautiously in the first Test, where conditions favored the fast bowlers, and then switching to his naturally aggressive style in the second game. This versatility will serve him well in Test cricket, especially on challenging tours like Australia," Kumble said. "As for his batting, I believe he has the game to take on the Aussie bowlers. There won't be as much seam movement as you'd encounter in England or South Africa. In New Zealand, you'd also see some movement, but in Australia, it's more about bounce and carry. He just needs to adapt to that."
